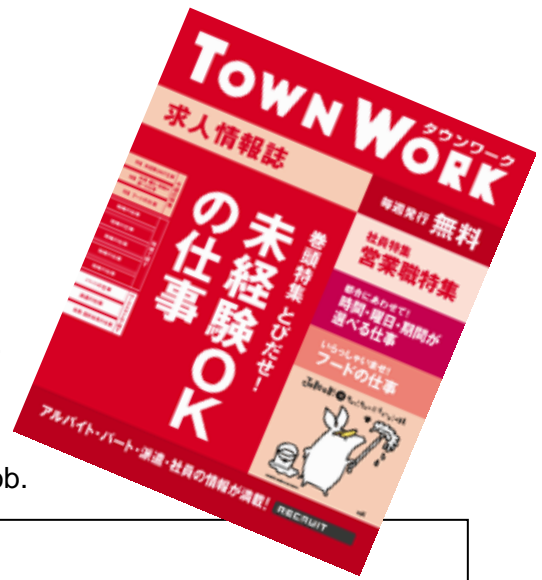


Dream Part Time Jobs!
