Running Quiz Teacher's Notes

Much of the content for this quiz is taken from unit 8, so it obviously best to do it after you have finished the unit - both to see how many of the facts they can remember, and also to consolidate the target language.

- i** Put students into small groups.
- ii** Write a couple of sentences similar to those in the quiz on the board. Ask students if they are true or false. Mistakes could be factual or grammatical. If false, elicit the true sentence.
- iii** Hand out the worksheet, one per group. You ought to enlarge it to B4 or A3, in order for there to be enough space to write the sentences.
- iv** Go through the instructions at the top of the worksheet.
- v** When a student runs up to you, ask them which sentence they want, then say it to them. They then run back to their group, and dictate the sentence to another student, who must write it down.
- vi** Group then decides if the sentence is correct, and writes the true sentence where appropriate.
- vii** A different student then runs to you for the next sentence.
 - * Obviously some groups will work faster than others, both in terms of doing the running dictation, and in deciding if it is correct. Use your own judgement when deciding how to deal with this!
- viii** Organize a quiz of some kind to decide which group should win a point for each sentence.
- ix** Maybe continue the quiz by thinking of sentences yourself, or get each group to come up with a few. *Obviously any facts would be OK - not just those stated in the unit.*
